



Diving Equipment Checklist For Cozumel 2004

1. **Mask/Snorkel/Fins/Booties**
2. BCD
3. Regulator with Octopus
4. 500 PSI Defog
5. Pressure gauge with depth gauge and compass
6. Ankle Weights: If needed
7. Wet Suit: A full 3mm jumpsuit is perfect. If you're brave, a shorty might do.
8. Reef Gloves: Cozumel may allow them or may not, we'll find out when we get there, but bring them just in case.
9. Swim Suit (2 preferably, so that you can alternate them)
10. Primary Light, Backup Light and Night Dive markers
11. Spare parts kit (o-rings, straps, silicone spray, tie wraps, light bulbs, mouth piece)
Your trip leader, John Bailey, will have a spare parts kit, but its always better to be safe than sorry. If you've got something that's unique, bring a spare just in case.
12. **Log Book**: to show your experience
13. **Certification Card**
14. Dive Computer or Dive Tables
15. Dive Slates
16. Gear Clips
17. Dive Watch
18. Batteries for lights and cameras and such
19. Large Mesh bag: (Stahlsac) To take your gear to the boat. Leave the travel bag in your room.
20. Slicker and Rain suit: It may not be raining, but if your wet & the wind is blowing or the boat is traveling 30 knots/hr it may get chilly.
21. Wide Brim / Foldable hat; Beach Towel; comfortable shoes: NOT FLIP FLOPS
22. Dry Bag: To keep your towel dry
23. Travel Alarm Clock
24. **Passport!!!!**
25. **Notarized Parental Consent Forms**
26. Medical forms: if you are bringing meds that customs might look twice at

Photographers
